

# **The Childs View and Gardening news**

Thank you all so much for the beautiful photographs depicting Spring that were taken by you and your children. They are absolutely gorgeous and have lent themselves to many a discussion on the seasons and how things grow. Keeping to this theme we have some very exciting news! We have been able to obtain permission from Islington Council, The Church of England Diocese and our lovely local residents who maintain our garden to have some ladybug planters, Bug Hotel and surrounding stumpery in the garden!

As part of our Montessori curriculum, we expose our children to the idea of caring for the environment and the part we can all play in helping to protect our planet. Through songs, stories and projects we help them to relate to and appreciate the natural world and understand how to care for living things. With this in mind, we would absolutely love to build and place the following in the gardens in conjunction with our children and parents.

<u>Ladybird planters</u> - We can learn to grow our own vegetables, starting life and sustaining it through care and attention. The teachers and children have already started painting wooden planters, depicting a bright yellow and bright red ladybird and are looking forward to planting produce that they will be able to eat after Half Term!

**Bug Hotel (Bug Ben)** - teaches us about recycling, using things again rather than throwing them away as well as creating a wildlife habitat. We would absolutely love it if there were any parents keen to help us design and build this, please refer to the image below of a Bug Ben we created in my local park. **Stumpery** - Similar to a log pile, deadwood makes a wonderful wildlife habitat, providing food and shelter for a huge number of invertebrates, including wood boring beetles, solitary bee's, woodlice and stag beetles. This will be put in place once the Bug Hotel is built and we will call on all gardeners for any branches, stumps and logs they can spare. We are so looking forward to the children and local community enjoying the finished product!


